Chapter 10-Day 3

- Reform movements people put effort into helping needy
- Social Gospel Movement—work to better conditions according to biblical ideas of charity
- Salvation Army—offered practical aid and religious counseling
- YMCA—offered religious instruction, plus facilities with gyms, libraries, pools, and rooms to rent
- Settlement House movement started by people doing Christian duty to help poor. Jane Addams started Hull House in Chicago.
- Demand for skilled workers led to focus on schools and colleges in late 1800s
- African American did not have equal education opportunities. Started their own schools.
- 1881 Tuskegee Institute in Alabama founded by Booker T. Washington
