

Chapter 11-Day 3

- Brutal violence against African Americans between 1890-1899 an average of 187 lynchings each year –80% in the South
- 1892 Ida B. Wells, young African American woman, launched fearless crusade against lynching
- Booker T. Washington—influential educator—proposed Atlanta Compromise—African Americans needed to prepare themselves educationally and vocationally for equality
- WEB DuBois leader for new generation of African Americans argued only by demanding their rights would they receive them, particularly concerned with protecting their voting rights
