Dear students, parents and guardians,

¡Bienvenidos a la clase de español! (Welcome to Spanish class!)

Class description: this is a high school credit class and will be taught through the four communication skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students will acquire basic vocabulary used in daily life situations, grammar concepts, and some cultural elements of a few Latin-American countries. We will go over greetings, the Spanish alphabet, colors, numbers, weather, slang words, conversational phrases, and much more. Spanish 1 is a very active class!

Class supplies: a sturdy notebook, one folder with pockets to save handouts, wide ruled leaf paper, pencil, eraser, and a red pen for grading. Have them ready by Wednesday, August 16th.

Quizlet App: we will use Quizlet to enter unit vocabulary and to play. We will create the accounts next week during your class time. Studying at home using the app will help memorize new terms faster and in a fun way.

Practice work (Bell Work): Monday through Thursday as soon as the bell rings.

Classwork: most of our assignments can be completed during class time while others will be done at home. Students will grade most of their own work in class. Cheating and dishonest grading will be penalized with a zero without a retake. Tardy homework will be worth 60% if completed correctly.

Absent students: You have one day per absence to turn in missed work. Always check the Planbook site to see the lesson plans you will be missing and ask a classmate to pass you important notes. I rarely post assignments in Google Classroom because most of our work must be done in class so it is very important that you keep me informed via email of your return so we can schedule a day to complete certain activities. I can extend the due date on some situations.

Textbooks: If you would like to check out a book to keep at home throughout the school year, ask me for one.

Early finishers: if you finish your work early you can study new vocabulary, review a topic, read a book, organize your folder, or work for another class (if you are current with the Spanish class).

Tests, quizzes and speaking presentations: we will have four to five unit quizzes (30 questions each= 30 points). Two semester tests (40 questions each = 40 points). Two or three major <u>memorized</u> speaking presentations projects worth 30-50 points each. Expect weekly brief speaking presentations with a partner worth usually 10 points each.

Retakes: you will have one opportunity to retake any low score or failed assignment or quiz within a week. I always keep the highest grade. Retakes will be offered at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays (classroom) or Thursdays (high school commons). I am also available during my planning period (2:15-3:00 p.m.) on most days. **<u>Requisite</u>**: talk to me to schedule a day for you to come so I can have your work ready. Semester tests can't be retaken.

Minor discipline issues will be handled as follow: First incident: verbal warning. Second incident: Parents/guardians will be contacted. Third incident: a discipline form will be sent to the principal for a disciplinary consequence. Major behavior issues will be handled by school administration at the first offense.

Cell Phones, hand held devices, watches & any other messaging technology: must be kept in a school locker or student vehicle.

Bathroom breaks: to avoid distractions and missing lesson information, no bathroom breaks are allowed unless certain circumstances.

Grading scale: 90-100 = "A" 80-89 = "B" 70-79 = "C" 60-69 = "D" 0-59 = "F"

Ineligibility List: If a student has been on probation for two consecutive weeks, I will need to notify a parent/guardian.

Our class values: be respectful, be honest, have a positive attitude and work hard.

Classroom Rules & Procedures:

- Enter and leave the room quietly.
- Be in your seat and ready to start your work when the bell rings.
- Do not leave your seat while I am teaching or during student presentations.
- Take care of class materials
- Keep your desk and the classroom clean.
- Wait in your seat to be dismissed.

Other class rules: Foods and snacks in class are allowed only during class celebrations (or some other situations). Bottled water is fine under the desk. No blankets, grooming/makeup or sleeping in class. Gum is fine. Backpack must stay in your locker.

Please adhere to Sequoyah Public Schools guidelines and regulations for a successful school year and to avoid unnecessary disciplinary consequences. A copy of the Student Handbook is available in the classroom.
